Appendix C: Seat belt fitment tables

Seat belt fitment rules for passenger vehicles, motor caravans, ambulances, minibuses, coaches, buses other than with standing passengers, goods vehicles, and 3-wheeled vehicles, tricycles and quadricycles MOT tests

Sub-sections

1. All motor vehicles
2. Passenger vehicles, motor caravans and ambulances with up to 8 passenger seats
3. Minibuses, motor caravans and ambulances with 9 to 16 passenger seats
4. Coaches
5. Other buses, except those designed for urban use with standing passengers
6. Goods vehicles
7. Three-wheeled vehicles, tricycles and quadricycles

In this section there are a lot of seat belt fitment tables. Not all of them are relevant to the Class 4 and 7 tester course you are about to do. By all means look at them all but we suggest you focus on sub-sections 1,2,3,7
