You will need to learn to find your way around the site so you can look up answers for your exams and to use as a reference guide once you become a tester.

We have set out below some **study material** which will give you a chance to read and answer some questions. You will probably have to look up some of the answers

If you have a laptop or other windows device the best way to search within the Manual is by pressing **Control and F together** and enter what you are searching for in the box that appears. It is not Google, so it will only search for exactly what you ask it to. Most of the time the less words you use will yield the best results. You will sometimes get a number of results ie 1 of 20. When this happens, you will need to use the arrow buttons near the box to search each of the results found. If you put in a search that shows it has 350 results, I suggest you use another word.

Please **read through the information and answer the questions**. They will help you, both during the training and when taking the exam, as well as when you become a tester.

The Inspection Manual is split up into sections. Each one of the sections breaks down into a range of sub-sections. On these work sheets we will give you some information, but you should look up more and **familiarise yourself with the manual** as best you can.

Read the information below and answer the questions at the end of each worksheet. The number of questions vary dependent upon how many sub-sections there are in each subject. There is one question per sub-section.

If you get stuck on a question just move on. You can always ask on the course if you cannot find it.
